

NORTH UNION PUMPING STATION
REPLACEMENT PROJECT UPDATE 3/26/25



The Lambertville Municipal Utilities Authority (LMUA) anticipates beginning the construction project to replace the North Union Street pumping station on or about April 4th. LMUA's contractor, Dulaine Contracting, will set up a bypass system before demolishing the existing pump station. Residents and businesses can expect no parking during work hours from 7:00 a.m.- 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday on N. Union Street, on the northbound side starting in front of the pump station, and four (4) parking spots down to the intersection of Cherry Street. The sidewalk will be closed for public safety in front of the station and on the Cherry Street Park side of the station. Temporary alternate routes and crossing areas will be set up and clearly marked.

The entire construction project is expected to be completed in four months. During this time, there will be three disruptions in traffic while the precast building and two underground vaults are put into place. Each are to be done and completed on separate days with police assistance with traffic control.

A crane and only necessary equipment and materials will be kept on site by the station in the City approved area in the Cherry Street Park. Since the property of the pump station is very limited due to its small size, the LMUA plans to keep most of the materials off site at the treatment plant.
